

R's & R's – PHILBIN BEACH – 2019

(or, how to Relax & Rejuvenate at Philbin Beach while following the Rules & Regulations . . .)

The Basics:

- The license plate on the car entering the lot must match one of the license plate numbers on the permit. This years' permit is orange.
- For permits with more than one plate number, only one car on that permit may park at any given time.
- If you rent your property, your renters must purchase their own permit. Not honoring this policy could result in the revocation of your permit.

Helpful Tips:

- Allow the attendant to check your permit as you drive in.
- Please park next to another vehicle. This helps us maximize our limited space.
- Pull all the way up to the shrubs – don't let your back end hang out into the driving path.
- Sometimes it takes a village to **back out** at Philbin. Please ask for help if needed. Remember that practicing 3-point turns builds character and solid driving skills.

Things to consider:

- People look different when driving in their car than they do riding a bike. If the attendant doesn't recognize you, please don't take it personally.
- For this reason, bring your walk-on pass if you bicycle to the beach.
- If you have forgotten your walk-on pass, the secret password this year is "eucalyptus".

Unspoken Rules:

- If you are going to have a party at the beach it is helpful to let us know in advance. And, you must inform the Aquinnah Police if you will have out-of-town guests parking.
- We all know people bring dogs during off-hours. Clean up after them! This is a serious problem and only hurts the dogs that have responsible owners.

Finally . . . :

- Stuff happens. Your car broke down and you are driving a rental car for two days. Please talk to the attendant, we can probably figure out an easy solution.

It is always better to tell us what's going on than to hope we don't catch you. It is our job to catch you! ☺
